Applying a Population Health Perspective to Health Planning and Decision-Making

Canadian Population Health Initiative, Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI)

Keynote speaker:

Dr. Saqib Shahab, Saskatchewan's Deputy Chief Medical Health Officer, will provide a presentation entitled, **The changing demographics of Saskatchewan: considerations for population health assessment**

Workshop overview:

This workshop focuses on practical aspects of bringing a population health lens to program-planning processes. It is assumed that participants will have a basic knowledge of the concepts and principles of population health covered in the CIHI e-module, An Introduction to Population Health. The workshop consists of a mix of presentation and group activities. Participants work in groups to map health issues using a modified social ecological model and to consider the types of interventions that may be best-suited to their own practice settings.

Learning Objectives:

- Identify the potential relevance of a population health perspective to health professionals in various settings;
- Understand how social determinants of health research and a population perspective can be applied to health-planning processes
- Demonstrate awareness of the interrelated and multidimensional factors that should be taken into consideration in the development of interventions designed to improve health/reduce health disparities;
- Use program-planning and brainstorming activities to identify what needs to be targeted with an intervention program; and
- Describe the distinctions between universal targeted interventions and the relevance of each to a comprehensive approach to population health planning.

Topics:

- Definitions, key concepts and frameworks
- Key sources of national and regional data
- Interpreting and using regional data
- Identification of key challenges in applying a population health perspective
