**Tenure-Track or Clinical-Track Faculty Position in Veterinary Epidemiology
Department of Comparative Pathobiology, College of Veterinary Medicine**

Job Summary

The Department of Comparative Pathobiology (CPB) at Purdue University College of Veterinary Medicine (PVM) is seeking a Veterinary Epidemiologist with an emphasis on infectious diseases. This is a tenure-track or clinical-track faculty position. Academic rank (assistant, associate, or full professor) and compensation will be commensurate with academic record and experience.

Qualifications:

- Ph.D. (or equivalent) in infectious disease epidemiology or a related One Health field conferred at the time of appointment.
- Record of peer-reviewed publications and conference presentations commensurate with experience.

Responsibilities:

The establishment of an independent, extramurally funded research program that trains graduate students and post-doctoral researchers is essential for those appointed in a tenure-track position. The establishment of multi-disciplinary and collaborative research is an expectation of clinical track faculty.

Candidates will also be expected to:

- fulfill teaching assignments in the DVM, veterinary nursing, and graduate programs
- participate in mentoring undergraduate, graduate, and professional DVM students
- provide epidemiology and statistics support to faculty, residents, interns, and graduate students at the College of Veterinary Medicine

Application Process

To be considered, each application should include:

- 1) curriculum vitae
- 2) a statement of teaching philosophy/summary of teaching experience
- 3) a summary of past research and future research plans
- 4) the names and contact information of three professional references
